Introduction

Published by the American Psychological Association, the bibliographic database PsycINFO is a widely used source of information for psychologists. However, many outside the discipline are also discovering the usefulness of PsycINFO for research related to clinical psychopharmacology. Psychiatrists, clinical researchers, and others will find both basic and applied research on the use of drugs in clinical settings, with an emphasis on the behavioral component.
